## Themes throughout Art & Design

Drawing and sketchbooks – Surface and colour – Working in three dimensions

## Why these themes?

Drawing and sketchbooks – Throughout this theme, children engage in drawing, collage, and mark-making activities. They are introduced to sketchbooks, where they develop drawing and composition skills. Additionally, they explore drama and performance, as well as storytelling through art. Furthermore, they investigate the process of transforming 2D drawings into 3D objects.

Surface and colour – In this theme, children engage in various artistic activities, including creating collages, exploring colour mixing, experimenting with markmaking techniques, and studying artists' approaches. They learn about how artists work with different media and develop distinct styles, such as contemporary art. Additionally, they explore the use of layers and juxtaposition to create their own artwork.

Working in three dimensions – Throughout this theme, children experiment with materials, transforming familiar objects into novel and enjoyable creations. Additionally, they create moving drawings, explore the use of food as an artistic medium to foster connections, delve into set design and study how artists manipulate light, form, and colour in their work.
