

Managing Group Chats: Protect Your Child on WhatsApp

- 1. Open WhatsApp: Launch the WhatsApp app on your child's device.
- 2. Go to Settings: Tap the three dots in the top right corner and select "Settings."
- 3. Select Account: Tap on "Account" and then "Privacy."
- Choose Groups: Tap on "Groups" under the Privacy settings.
- 5. Set Group Permissions: You will see three options:
- 6. Everyone: Anyone can add your child to groups.
- 7. My Contacts: Only contacts in your child's phone can add them to groups.
- 8. My Contacts Except: Select specific contacts who cannot add your child to groups
